


Geographic distribution of Wiley article output (corresponding authors, 2018)

Plan S has added further momentum





Full immediate transition; combined 'publish and read' approach




Norway & Hungary Stepped- transition, investment migrates from 'read' to 'publish'

Publishers making the same transition: illustration from MPDL






As of 2017 the Max Planck Institute had four transitional agreements in place - shown here in Green

The journal *Clinical Genetics* piloted the world's first scalable, automated way to publish an article's complete peer review process

Publish

We give authors the option to choose to publish unsigned (or signed) peer review reports, author responses, and editor decision letters with journal articles for readers to learn from.

Reward

We enable recognition and reward for the peer review and editorial work that's part of a published study but that otherwise remains hidden

Clarify


Transparent Peer Review

A high proportion of authors chose transparent peer review. 1841 of 2107 authors chose transparent peer review (that's 87%).

Editors did not send more invitations to secure the number of peer reviewers they were looking for. Overall, on average across the journals, we found no meaningful difference in the number of reviewers invited.

The time taken to share an initial decision with the authors after peer review did not change. Within this overall result, two journals did show meaningful differences: They were quicker by around 20 days.

Editors have changed their behavior, by making more direct decisions for authors. On average, editors declined to send manuscripts out for peer review in 62% of manuscripts compared with 53% previously.
